

ACADEMICS

Kristin was the first IB continuum school in New Zealand, introducing the IB Diploma Programme first in 1989.

Today, IB programmes are taught at all levels of the school: Primary Years Programme (PYP), Middle Years Programme (MYP) and the IB Diploma Programme in the Senior School. The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme is an internationally benchmarked pre-university qualification. www.ibo.org

Kristin's average IB pass rate is 98% (worldwide 81%) with an average score of 35 points (worldwide 30 points). Over 20% of Kristin students are awarded 40+/45 (vs 8% world-wide), including students with a perfect score of 45.
